President's Message

Jumbo Tosai...

The April club meeting was held at Sunset Koi. Victoria Dolan had just received a shipment of jumbo Tosai consisting of three Sanke and three Kohaku from Pan Intercorp's Zac Schmidt.

Club members were asked to study each koi and judge them. Club president John Watkins then presented Judge Schmidt's assessment of each fish. The best Kohaku and Sanke are shown below.

Kohaku #4991

Judge Schmidt points out this koi has a frame that can support jumbo growth and good conformation. High quality Beni pattern and sharp Kiwa are enhanced by richness of color. The three-step Beni pattern is very desireable in Kohaku.

"This Kohaku looks fantastic today but should really shine when it reaches 25 inches-plus and carries a full body.

Sanke #4921

Three Sanke were on hand for our judging evaluation and education.

This Sanke was chosen by Judge Schmidt for its big frame and large bone structure which will support jumbo growth. Powerful shoulder Sumi draws the eye to the main highlight of this koi. Because Sumi sits on top of the Beni here, it is even deeper and more rich looking. Sumi stepping stones create balance from front to back. Without this powerful step of Sumi this Sanke would be very front and rear loaded. Sanke are based on Kohaku coloring so the two-step pattern is classic Nidan. The Beni wraps down

on each side and the large Beni will help this Sanke carry a strong presence as this koi grows.

Ink-black Sumi is well balanced from head to tail and is the strong point of this Sanke. The Odome (tail stop) Hi ends at just the right spot and anchors the overall pattern.

"This Sanke is one that can be enjoyed today. It's very well finished and could be taken to show right away."
