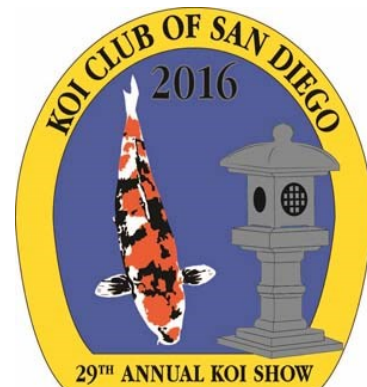

The President's Corner

San Diego's summer surely is just about over, wouldn't you think? The heat in August. And September. And October. So heat, or lack thereof, we are still into "winter" as much as we ever admit it. Ben Plonski, of Laguna Koi Ponds touched on that very fact when he spoke at the October meeting at Mickey and Sherry Goldman's home. Time to cut back on feeding your fish.

Time to do a major clean out of your filter. Time to take a bus ride with the club and pick out a few new treasures to add to your pond.

If you missed the meeting at the Goldman's, you missed a mouth-watering assortment of sliders, with, for the perfect finish, ice cream and cookies. Their pond is impeccably maintained as the photo on the front of the October newsletter shows. Thank you, Mickey and Sherry for a wonderful experience.

As owner of Laguna Koi Ponds, Ben shared with us some of his experiences on Japan buying trips and a complete description of just what those Japanese fish have to go through to be released for sale when they arrive in California — including expensive testing for KHV (Koi Herpes Virus), a disease that remains invisible until all the fish in your pond start dying. Ben has been a consistent supporter of the koi hobby - a presence at our show, helping members, and, most recently, in bringing three 7" fish for the drawing.

We will be visiting his Laguna Beach location on November 21 during our bus trip. The new fish he purchases in Japan should be ready to go to good homes, although I will remind you Ben has a keen eye for quality fish. The bus is filling up quickly. The cost is \$35 per person, which includes lunch as well as stopping at four LA dealers. 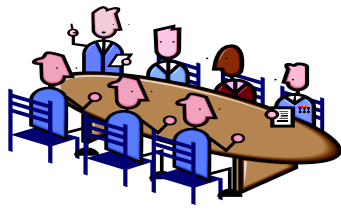

Jerry has a new form service to replace Adobe Forms, but it is too archaic and limited to meet our website's needs. Please send any other software suggestions for handling online forms to Jerry for consideration. It was reported the Menus on the web page were not working. Jerry will check them out and if not working will report it to Go Daddy for them to fix. Jerry is learning a new service designed to streamline the website.

The Japanese Friendship Garden's lower pond is now the new home for nine koi that were donated to the Garden.

Our club's Show ad will be in the January/February issue of Koi USA.

Jack Chapman, our club's KHA (Koi Health Advisor) reminds us that Fall is the time of year to thoroughly clean your bio-filter, not Spring. Some reports of late algae blooms. Jack announced that Jerry Myers has been accepted into the Koi Organisation International program for KHA's and received one of their scholarships. Also, Linda Pluth has applied to AKCA for their KHA program so our club may have 3 KHA's in the near future.

Dr. Bob Adler, our Show Chairman, has scheduled the third Koi Show meeting for Wednesday, October 21st at 7pm at his office in Hillcrest: 920 Washington St., San Diego. Please R.S.V.P. if attending. If you are not available to attend be sure to forward your interest to Bob so you can be included in any plans, emails etc.

Fall Season in Southern California

So we are now in the fall season and for those in the coast area you will see lower temps soon and we inland will still have some warmer days late into fall. Good time to sit with your koi and evaluate what you and your fish have been doing for the past six or seven months. What were your goals or what were you hoping to see happen during this past spring and summer season? Even if you did not have any goals it's a good time to review what has happened with your pond system and your koi (really). Even if you only wanted the status quo or nothing bad to happen – so what happened and what were you doing to maintain your pond and koi??? This is when I put my shameless plug in for you to have a *pond journal* even if you only write in it a couple times a year!!! It's even a good time to think about what would you like to see happen next year (pond and koi)??? So now that you're out by your pond and making notes (past and future) and maybe on your second drink LOL it's time to get the pond and koi ready for your winter season. Paying attention to your pond and koi during the winter season better prepares your pond and your koi for a hopefully uneventful spring. For us with mild winters, I like to advocate that a good filter cleaning (Sept. - Oct.) is an excellent way to prepare your pond and koi for the winter season. Your koi's immune system is fully charged and there is less chance of having sick koi from the unavoidable stuff (bacteria/particulate matter/critters) you will add to the water column from a good cleaning. Good time to have less junk (detritus – decomposing organic compounds “DOC”) in your filter for the bad bugs to winter over on and explode their populations in early spring with possible resulting sick koi (aeromonas alley or even parasites). With winter comes leaves and you want to always keep them out of your pond and filter system as they are the hotels for the bad bugs as they decompose. This mass of DOC also erodes water quality. If you have water plants this is when they die back so work at removing the dead plant material and clean out the stinky pots!! Time to think about reducing the quantity of food and going to an all season or wheat germ based food. When my pond water hits 52F I'll begin feeding every other day and at 50F twice a week and quit at 48F. Koi articles recommend stop feeding at 50F and I have a friend with nice koi who stops at 52F. Water temp down means koi metabolism down (cut in half for each 17 degrees Fahrenheit) - so the koi do not have the capability to process high levels of protein. Unprocessed food passes out the vent and provides high value nutrition for the bad bugs during winter giving you a larger base population come aeromonas alley in the spring (BIG TIME). A lot of our local area ponds do not go below 47/48F during winter and aeromonas does not go dormant until around 39F. Koi get larger each year and we have been known to add koi from time to time so it's a good time to review filtration and bio-chamber capacity to keep up with the ammonia/nitrite pollution demand. Don't forget DOC adds additional ammonia to the water column. Remember we have recirculating systems that have to refresh the water our koi pollute with each breath, pee and poop. **NO – twice the size = twice the pollution.** Think 3 to 4 times the pollution due to body mass. Adding bio-filter capacity in the fall is a good idea as it will be on line (up and running) for spring or you could consider a reduction in fish load (no joke). Just because it's winter time does not mean your pond maintenance goes on vacation.

Also at this time of year (Oct. - Nov.) is when the new koi arrive at your favorite koi dealer – so take some time and see what you have that could be moved on at next year's koi auction (May) and what would be a nice replacement now. Red is considered best as a primary color when viewing your koi population as a group in your pond. It does not matter if you want a 20/200/2,000 dollar koi or just a fun day with koi friends you just can't beat the \$35 with lunch included bus trip our club is taking on the 21st of Nov. to 4 LA area quality koi dealers that have supported our club and annual koi show for many years!!!

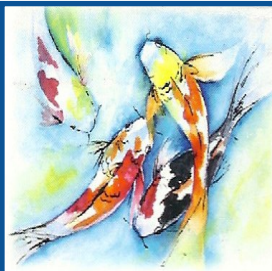

Koi Club of San Diego Ponder Profile

Vito and Nathalee Adragna Lakeside, California

Vito and Nathalee have spent the last dozen years creating an extremely beautiful parklike setting that covers their large property in Lakeside. Both retired from a construction company where Nathalee managed the books and Vito was the consummate general maintenance technician and overall Jack of All Trades. Vito has used his skills as a designer, engineer, carpenter, welder, plumber, mason, electrician and many other trades to build their dream retirement home. When asked, Vito is quick to explain that he couldn't have done it without Nathalee as his partner who is by his side on each and every project. Vito said the vision actually started when he was living in a camper for a year saving money for a down payment on a "ranch" that he had in mind. He shared this vision with Nathalee and the rest is history.

As you can see from the photos, the large deck complete with gazebo and pizza oven overlooks their 25,000 gallon concrete pond. The pond itself is the result of 'what to do with a large hole after they pulled out a tree stump.' Now the beautiful pond is home to over two dozen healthy koi. With the help of Jerry Myers most of the koi have been rehomed to their pond through the Koi Club of San Diego's Vagabond Koi Rescue and Rehoming program. Jerry was also instrumental in helping to redesign the filter system that uses a 1/2 hp William Lim Dragon pump, 10,000 gallon converted sand filter and two 75 watt UV's. A 25 foot stream bed runs into the pond from a huge water wheel that was, of course, designed and build right here in the workshop.

The workshop is also home to other hobbies that include a beautiful hand built '32 Ford Roadster and Old School Pickup with a huge Hemi under the hood. As you can see from the photo of the '32 on the custom made bridge, these folks are always ready to go cruising with their Car Club at any time. The "Ranch" is now reality!

Vito and Nathalee are very active in the Club's Vagabond Koi Rescue Program and rarely miss an opportunity to get down and dirty to save a fish. Thank you so much for sharing your beautiful home with us and we look forward to visiting this wonderland for our next general meeting!

A Man of Many HATS



The Annual Photo Contest is open to all active members of The Koi Club of San Diego.

You may e-mail the photos to info@koicsd.org and they will be posted to the site. The photos (limit of 5 per entrant) should be submitted digitally to our Webmaster for the website with his requirements as follows:

Picture file names: Simple file names are good. File names generated by most cameras are fine.

Picture size: Use your camera's highest resolution. A larger size picture does not equate to high resolution, they are two different things. Camera phones are somewhat limited in their resolution for the most part unless you have a newer phone. The resolution we are looking for is 180 DPI and above, with 300 DPI being the best for print and enlargement. We need high resolution to enlarge the winner's photo for print publication and judging. Dots Per Inch (DPI) is the number of individual dots that can be placed in a line within the span of 1 inch. A picture with low resolution when enlarged becomes pixilated (you can see the individual pixels or Dots) The Webmaster will screen all photos to determine their suitability. If a picture consists of people, you may need each persons approval in order to have your picture used for publication.

Pictures can be viewed on the website. If you submitted a photo but do not see it on the website, it is being processed or may have been vetoed by the Webmaster for not following the above rules. If not accepted you will receive an email as to why. If you object to the reason you may present it to the steering committee at the next meeting for their review. You may also bring the picture with you to the November meeting.

Judging will be done by all members attending the November general meeting with the winner to be announced at the December Christmas Party. Judging will be based on content, artistic and technical merit.

The winner will receive bragging rights, an enlarged canvas mounted print of the winning picture and a \$25 gift certificate for use at the next Show. So put on your thinking caps, keep those batteries charged and take your camera with you wherever you go. You never know when an opportunity will present itself. Happy clicking!!

Webmaster notes: A large sized photo does not necessarily mean high resolution. Your camera needs to be set to the fine (highest resolution) setting. After your photos are submitted, you will be sent an email asking you to view and verify your photos. The winning photo becomes property of the Koi Club of San Diego and may be used to promote the club and the photographer will receive credit for their photo. The club reserves the right to edit the winning photo as necessary for publication. The winning photo may be selected for the cover of the Show Booklet. All photos will be posted and printed for judging as is. If necessary submissions will be resized for printing and viewing purposes. If you would like to change or replace an entry please send me an e-mail with the new photo and which photo you would like to replace.

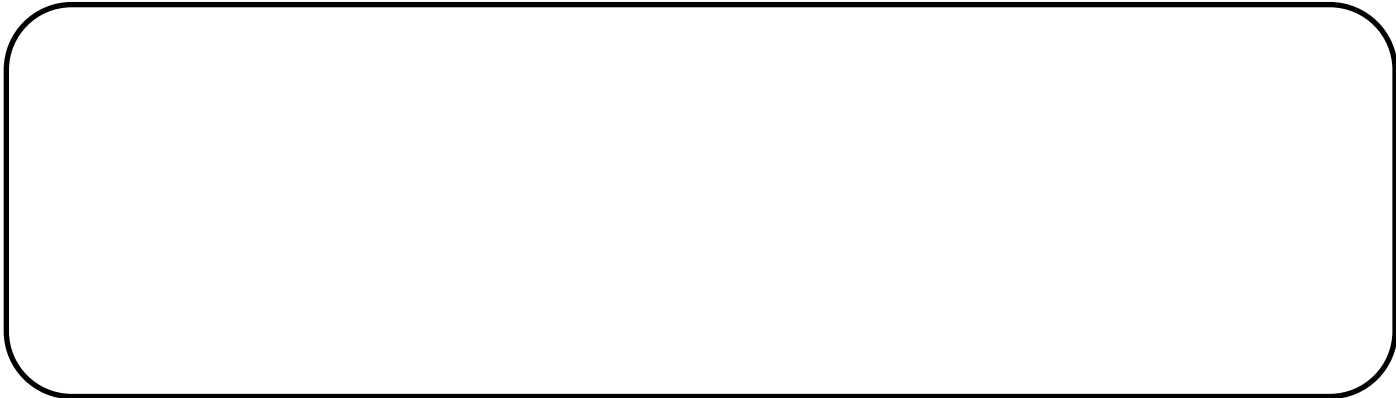
