Master Gardener Tips for Spring....

Careful With Wet Soil



Most of the soil in our area is wetter than it's been in many years. And most of our soil is clay so it can easily be compacted. Those air spaces in the soil are important for the roots and for beneficial organisms that live in the soil. Try to avoid walking on, digging, or rototilling saturated soil.

Prepare your soil - winter weeds probably will be poking their heads up in your garden soil already, so pull them as soon as possible and move them far away. If you leave them too long, they will flower, produce seeds, and multiply. After you've waded through the weeds, add some fertilizer and mix it into the soil

Water Plant of the Month – Dana's Delight Pitcher Plant [Sarracenia 'Dana's Delight']



'Dana's Delight' is a lovely carnivorous creature with traps that are stained deep blood red. To about 16" tall and forming clumps from a plant that is best potted in pure peat moss with just a bit of gritty sand. Great in a bog or sitting in a container of shallow water. Fantastical, whimsical drooping green flowers...

Dana's Delight' is a hybrid based on species leucophylla with white hoods accented with much bolder dramatic red veins than other cultivars and, in fullest sun, a pink flush through the white. Pitcher plants are best grown in moist, peaty, acid soil in full, hot sun. They are most easily grown in pots sitting in a saucer...

Kin Gin Rin Koi

I am sure we have all seen that sparkling koi that shimmers and shines in the sun, and thought what kind of koi is that. Let me share some information that can better define the different types of Kin Gin Rin (pronounced: keen geen deen) available, so that you can understand more about these beautiful diamond scaled koi.

What do the words "Kin Gin Rin" mean? Well it literally means Gold and Silver scales in Japanese. "Gin Rin" is the sparkling effect, which in some koi looks like crushed aluminum foil on their scales. It is caused by a chemical deposit on each of the Koi's scales.

A koi needs to have at least 2 complete rows of gin rin scales, preferably 3 or more, to be classified as Gin Rin variety to be entered into any koi show. Symmetry is very important when evaluating Gin Rin. Ideally scales should start at the base of the head and continue down the body of the koi, to the tail and including both sides of the dorsal fin. The rows of scales should be neatly aligned with no random or mismatched scales. When choosing a Gin Rin koi, first look at the Koi's body conformation, pattern, and now look at the Gin Rin scales; look for 2 or more rows that are neatly lined up in straight rows. Those with missing, random or jumbo sized scales should be avoided. Remember that the layout of the scales will not change as this koi grows. Finally pick the Gin Rin koi that sparkles and shines the most as these koi are judged on the quality of their scales.


Different types of Kin Gin Rin [see images on next page]:

- Pearl Gin Rin: The only raised one. Quite uncommon. It has a sparkle deposit in the center of each scale, making it look like a pearl.
- Diamond Gin Rin: Most common in U.S.A., not popular in Japan. Looks like brushed aluminum sparkle. Also known as Hiroshima Gin.
- Beta Gin most prized in Japan, but least common. This is where the whole scale sparkles and is most valued type.
- Kado Gin least appealing. Most common. Has only the aft edge of each scale covered with this sparkling deposit.

Japanese Koi Terminology


- Menware: Black lightening shaped pattern on the head of a koi.
- Motoguro: Black markings on base of pectoral fins on a Showa
- Sashi: Blurred line caused by white scales overlapping red ones on leading edge of Hi (red) scales
- Kiwa: Sharpness of edge of color on koi scale


Gin Rin koi can come in any variety of koi, as such, you would add Gin Rin before the variety's names, such as Gin Rin Showa, Gin Rin Kohaku, and Gin Rin Sanke, just to name a few. Gin Rin Showa are my favorite as I love how the red, black and white pattern are intensified with the glitter of the gin rin scales. Watching this koi swim around in the pond, and when the sun catches those shiny scales, is something I could watch all day. As they say, "diamonds are a girl's best friend", and when it is on a koi, even better.
