

Plant of the Month - "Blue Beauty" [Nymphaea odorata]



The "Blue Beauty" water lily is a perennial plant that is large, very fragrant and has light blue flowers in the daytime. The leaves arise on flexible stalks from large thick rhizomes. The leaves are more round than heart-shaped, bright green, 6 to 12 inches in diameter with the slit about 1/3 the length of the leaf. Leaves usually float on the water's surface. Flowers arise on separate stalks, have brilliant yellow petals with yellow centers. The flowers may float or stick above the water and each opens in the morning and closes in the afternoon. The flowers are very fragrant. White water lily can spread from seeds or the rhizomes.

Submerged portions of all aquatic plants provide habitats for many micro and macro invertebrates. These invertebrates in turn are used as food by fish and other wildlife species (e.g. amphibians, reptiles, ducks, etc). After aquatic plants die, their decompostion by bacteria and fungi provides food (called "detritus") for many aquatic invertebrates.

Monthly Club Report to Associated Koi Clubs of America (AKCA)



AQUAPONIC SYSTEM



Aquaponics is a hybrid food growing technology that combines aquaculture (growing fish) and hydroponics (growing veggies in non-soil media and nutrient-laden water).

Aquaponics is intended to be a production system that incorporates principles of water conservation and sustainable vegetable production. Systems vary in size. The systems are usually fresh-water based.

Benefits of Backyard Ponds

Many Benefits can be obtained by having a backyard pond. Freshwater habitats are needed to sustain wildlife and provide a needed water source to creatures of all types such as insects, spiders, crustaceans, amphibians, reptiles, fish, birds and mammals.

Providing a home with clean water to sustain life is helpful to our environment. Birds, butterflies, bees, and other wildlife benefit from our ponds. Plants provide shade, food and cover for a wide diversity of pond life. Rocks, bark, and branches along the ponds edge provide protection for small animals and fish. Native

plants do well and often provide the better source of food and cover for native wildlife. A variety of colors and shades of plantings make the landscape interesting and varied with textures and shapes both for us and the animals.

Water storage is another benefit of backyard ponds. Having sources of clean fresh water provides protection from fire, rain runoff, flooding, and can prevent soggy spots in your landscape. Having a pond in your backyard also has cooling effects on the microclimate and be used to water plants in the nearby landscape.

Beauty is a big benefit of having a backyard pond. A pond adds to the look and feel of a backyard. All of us are instinctually drawn to the natural waterscape with lush plantings and the sounds and smells of moving water. We connect with the life cycle that the pond plays out in real time as we enjoy the changing seasons. One day a lily blooms. Another, a dragonfly emerges. Koi swim and grow and eat out of your hand. The backyard pond becomes a focal point, a de-stressing point, a curiosity point that draws us closer, with interest. Underwater lighting makes the pond even more appealing at night. Having a backyard pond is not only beneficial but they are fun.



Last but not least, a big benefit of having a pond is meeting up with other pond keepers and helping each other with common issues, socializing with each other, learning about ponds and Koi, and maybe showing off your pond on next year's pond tour!
