Mark Stallcop will be our speaker. His topic will be "Easy Pond Makeovers – The Secret of Giant Faux Rocks. Make a Big Impact on your Pond Without Making a Big Impact on Your Wallet".



Mark will talk about some of the many things he has added to his pond in as little as a weekend that you could do too. Learn about giant faux rocks that will give your pond a dramatic look, rock bogs that clean the water and add beautiful flowers. Streams that bring tranquil sounds to your yard and ideas for simple Aquaponics that don't make you look like Hippy. Mark will walk us through what is needed to make a faux rock, basic steps for building and the artistic tricks that make them look real so you don't have to take two years of art school.

Mark and Shirley were House 1 in this year's tour and receive a lot of interest in their very large 7ft high rocks they built in their yard. Many people could not believe they were fake until the walked behind them and saw for themselves the concrete blocks they were made of. Plant of the Month - Water Poppy [Hydrocleys nymphoides)]



The Water Poppy (Hydrocleys nymphoides) is a compact, day blooming tropical lily that is native to South America. It is a floating aquatic, with Short-lived, lemon-yellow flowers that will bloom in the summer with red and brown centers. The leaves are oval, solid green occurring along 2-3' long stems that send out roots at each node, allowing for easy division. It is usually evergreen in warmer climates winter hardy in USDA Zones 8 to 11. The Water Poppy is ideal for planting in tubs and kettles.

Easily grown in calm water in full sun. Winter hardy to USDA Zone 8, in a pond it can spread up to 6 feet. The Water Poppy will survive in water up to 12 to 15" deep, but prefers shallow water conditions 4" to 8" depth. They also thrive in small tubs and kettles in the full sun. Pot in round, shallow,

solid containers of 3 gallons or more, in 6-18" of water. If overwintering is desired, bring plants indoors before first frost to a shallow tub or aquarium in strong light. If your lily is wintered inside, in the spring, set it out in full sun. Keeping it there until the water in the pot is approximately 80°F will get it to bloom sooner. Wait until the leaves have started to grow and the pond temperature is above 70°F before submerging the lily pot back in your pond. This prevents the plant from going into shock.

Koi Shows – Great Opportunities to View a Variety of Koi By Eve Bretzke

The Camellia Koi Club's Sacramento Koi Show 'A Taste of Excellence", will take place September 2 – 3 at the Old Sugar Mill Wineries, Clarksburg, CA. What are Koi Shows all About?

Koi hobbyist members of these clubs will be entering their best quality show koi fish to compete for trophies and prizes in many show categories. Size classifications will range from under nine inches to more than 30 inches. Judges will evaluate the koi fish entered into the competition to determine which are the rarest and in the highest demand. The judges will walk along rows of tanks to select the winning koi fish based on size, pattern, color and presence from the many koi fish on display to the public.

"The koi competition gives our hobby maximum exposure and helps introduce the beauty and appreciation of koi to new people in order to grow the hobby, said Carmen Caputo," president of a regional koi club chapter. "It's also a way to keep enthusiasts interested in learning more about selecting koi, pond maintenance and koi health," he said. Among the koi already admitted into the competition are Kohaku (bright snowy white with red markings), Showa (jet black base color with red and white accents), Platinum Ogon (solid white color with a brilliant metallic sheen), Shusui (white with an orange belly and blue scales along the back), Sanke (pure white adorned with red and black markings), Yamabuki Ogon (metallic gold color), and Doitsu (mirror-like scales along the back).

During the koi show, judges will walk through to highlight what made the prized fish unique and champion quality in their opinion. Expert judges may come from as far as Japan, others will be more local. All koi will be available for public viewing during the show.

Koi Shows – Great Opportunities to View a Variety of Koi (continued)

Nishikigoi, more commonly referred to as simply, koi are freshwater fish of the temperate zone, scientifically classified as belonging to the carp family, which originated in Central Asia and were brought to Japan from China about a thousand years ago. In the early part of the 19th century, some color mutations appeared in the freshwater fish. By cross-breeding those mutations repeatedly, a red-colored mutation appeared, and further cross-breeding led to the creation of multiple colors. These colorful fish, now kept by avid collectors throughout the region in elaborate private back yard ponds will be meticulously transported to the show for the competition. These koi show events will also feature vendors who cater to koi enthusiasts selling pond fish, koi food, koi medicine, pumps and associated merchandise.

Aquaponics is a hybrid food growing technology that combines aquaculture (growing fish) and hydroponics (growing veggies in non-soil media and nutrient-laden water).

Aquaponics is intended to be a production system that incorporates principles of water conservation and sustainable vegetable production. Systems vary in size. The systems are usually fresh-water based.


Monthly Club Report to Associated Koi Clubs of America (AKCA)
