Next Meeting: Tuesday, March 21st at 7:30 PM via Zoom Topic: April Club Events - ZNA / Cherry Blossom Shows

The club plans to participate in two local Koi community events this spring, first, the ZNA show April 1-2, 2023 and, second, the Cupertino Cherry Blossom Festival held April 29-30, 2023. Volunteers are needed.

March has been a mix of sun and rain so far. Many of us are looking forward to getting back to our ponds and water gardens as the weather warms. Now is a good time to plan improvements, take inventory of pond maintenance supplies, check plumbing and electrical systems, and make sure filters are working properly. If you are still without power, try to aerate the ponds best as you can.



The recent wind storms have played havoc with many, many ponds around our neighborhoods. Be on the lookout for pH or other water chemistry issues after these large downpours of rain. Our ponds are happy for the extra H2O but we have been getting reports that, while rain water is initially neutral in pH [a perfect 7.0] but very quickly absorbs low pH contaminants as it falls through the sky.

The effect of low pH rain on pH level is usually small, except for heavy rains over a period of days, which can require a need to raise your pH. We have also had reports of die off, smaller fish being impacted more so. When in doubt, test your pond water and adjust as needed.

ZNA Background: ZNA America is the North American Regional District of Zen Nippon Airinkai, an International society based in Beppu Japan. "Our mission statement and goal is to spread the hobby of koi keeping, to improve upon the husbandry techniques for maintaining koi, and to elevate the appreciation aspects of nishikigoi as living art". ZNA (Zen Nippon Airinkai) was first formed in Japan by local Japanese hobbyists. Starting from a regional organization in western Japan, this hobby movement of 'koi kichi' (translation: koi maniacs) evolved to redefine its identity and become a truly national/ International organization in 1968. Today there are chapters around the world.



Koi - Instinct for Survival?

A recent study from USC about why fish in general dart in various directions when they are preyed upon by other animals looked at the survival benefit of such behavior.

In short: the study indicates that a fish increases its chances of escape by moving at an angle perpendicular to the predator's direction of travel. However, the consistency of that response is dependent on the amount of neuronal processing required to sense the predator and respond accordingly. It's a strategy that applies the age-old wisdom of survival: "don't overthink it."

Fish foodies ...did you know??

- Nutritional deficiencies in fish mimic many other diseases
- A pond does not grow excess algae without "feeding" it
- Koi are opportunistic feeders, normally at the bottom

Some things to remember about Koi keeping...

- Koi take patience you can't rush their growth
- Pond depth is valuable to help control temperature
- Examine your fish frequently to insure they are free from abrasions, diseased scales, or parasites – treat regularly for parasites – all ponds have parasites sooner or later
- Pumps must be run 24 hours a day to insure good health and growth of the fish
- Some fish turn out great and some do not. There is no substitute for good blood lines.
- Test your water supply for salt content before you add any salt to the pond water
- Check with other club members when you have questions
