A little planning and attention now can insure a happy, healthy pond later. Check to see if your filters need a deep cleaning, remove any debris accumulated over winter. Tune up equipment as needed. What about fresh Koi food or other supplies for the coming season? Be sure to have dechlorinator on hand for water changes.

Spring Start-Up for Ponds

The beginning of the new pond season is the perfect time to evaluate and tweak your pond maintenance practices and take inventory of leftover pond care products from last year. Now is a good time to start planning for the upcoming season.

Past Seasons – What was good / what could be better...
Before buying new pond maintenance products, recall pond issues from past seasons. Were you fighting a recurring algae bloom, did you avoid the pond due to muck or gunk? Maybe plants (weeds) were



overgrown, was the pond unattractive for your backyard visitors... know which problems are the most important on your list. Address smaller issues before they become bigger issues. ©

Install an aeration system this Spring if you don't have one. Pond aeration systems infuse the water column with oxygen and circulate the entire water column. Aeration helps reduce pond muck formation and weed growth while keeping fish safe and comfortable.

Remove dead algae and debris. Keep dead algae from becoming additional muck at the bottom of the pond. Keep pond water clear and remove accumulated pond muck using mechanical netting and treat pond with beneficial bacteria as the weather warms. Plan to address the root of the most common pond problems -- excess nutrients and sunlight. Keeping up on regular maintenance will help to keep your pond looking its best all season with minimal effort!

Cherry Blossom Season – Welcome Spring!



Hanami is the Japanese tradition of welcoming Spring. Known as the Cherry Blossom Festival this annual event has, for hundreds of years, centered on the significance of the cherry blossom which, in Japanese culture, represents the fragility and the beauty of life. It is a reminder that life is almost overwhelmingly beautiful but that it is also tragically short.

In Japan, the cherry blossom is more than just a beautiful flowering tree. There are thousands upon thousands of cherry blossom trees in Japan, and each year the Japanese people

closely anticipate and follow the blossoming of the trees.

"In the cherry blossom's shade there's no such thing as a stranger." Kobayashi Issa

The flowers are deeply symbolic: their short-lived existence taps into a long-held appreciation of the beauty of the fleeting nature of life. The blossoms also, quite literally, symbolize new beginnings, with April 1 being the first day of both the financial and academic year in Japan. The flowers bloom for about a week before the so-called "sakura snow" effect starts and they float sadly off the trees.
