Presentation: Auto fills and Auto feeders: Automation options for your pond.

We will cover the club's fall activities and have a lively discussion on ways to automate pond chores – you know, those chores we can easily get disracted from doing as the weather changes... check your systems equipment, tune up needed now before winter. Check filters, test water, correct any issues that are present to have a happy winter season.

Winterizations start early to mid-November. Ponds are like

magnets when it comes to falling leaves, if you want to put a fall leaf net over the pond do it now, before the leaves start to fall. Nets are available that are high strength heavy duty and do not sag. No under-structure is needed for most ponds when using pond netting.

Netting comes in 12' and 25' width up to 100' long. Hooked stakes recommended every 2 feet or so. This combination will combat leaves and predators all winter protecting both your Koi and your equipment.

## **IWGS Recent Winner – Nymphnaea 'Tuonta'**

Nymphaea 'Tuonta' Hybridized by Nopchai Chansilpa, Thailand

**Nymphaeales**, the water lily order of flowering plants, containing 3 families, 6 genera, and 74 species. Members of the order are found in quiet freshwater habitats throughout most of the world. The aesthetic appeal of the water lilies, especially those of the genus *Nymphaea*, has led to their worldwide cultivation.

Nymphaeaceae (including the former family Barclayaceae), the water lily family, has 3 genera and 58 species. Cabombaceae, or the water shields and fanworts, is a closely related family with 2 genera, *Cabomba* and *Brasenia*. The last family, Hydatellaceae, contains 1 genus (*Hydatella*) and 12 species.
