Some members have asked about all the extra rainwater and how it may impact their pond's water. Rainwater does not cause pH crashes or KH drops. Rain is initially neutral in pH, a perfect 7.0 – but very quickly absorbs low pH contaminants as it falls through the sky. The effect of low pH rain on pH level is usually small, except for heavy rains over a period of days, which can require a need to raise your pH. When it doubt, test your water.

Did you know the legend of the waterfall, where a single Koi were rewarded for its perseverance and determination and turned into a dragon? One particular legend is the Koi fish's claim to fame. ## **Winter Pond Maintenance Checklist**

Keep up with maintenance between storms, and your pond will flow into springtime without major issues. Rainwater does not cause pH crashes or KH drops. Rain is initially neutral in pH, a perfect 7.0 – but very quickly absorbs low pH contaminants as it falls through the sky. The effect of low pH rain on pH level is usually small, except for heavy rains over a period of days, which can require a need to raise your pH. When it doubt, test your water.



#### Here is a list of items to check on:

- √ Remove some leaves and debris if possible
- ✓ Do 15-20% water change, your pond is going to sit idle for many months
- ✓ Give your fish a good footing by changing out some of that dirty, recycled water
- ✓ Make sure to use a dechlorinator to detoxify chlorine from the water and sodium bicarbonate
  to raise and buffer the pH
- ✓ Install an aeration system to release noxious gases
- ✓ Install a pond net, adding a net keeps leaves, debris and predators from getting in the pond
- ✓ Switch to a low protein diet when water temperature drops
- ✓ Keep pond clear of debris
- ✓ Water changes and top-offs are often needed during the winter months
- ✓ Use a dechlorinator when doing a small top-offs
- ✓ Don't forget to check your Koi for issues.
- ✓ Winter is when issues arise due to cooler conditions and water quality problems


